

ACCOUNTABILITY IN THE BODY OF CHRIST

Introduction: The Bible uses many metaphors to describe various aspects of the church. One unique to the New Testament is that the church is like a body. This implies at least three basic concepts:

- 1) Unity. There is no such thing as an isolated believer.
- 2) Diversity. Every believer can find a place to use his gift.
- 3) Harmony. It is not always the most obvious gift that is the most vital.

I. The Definition of Accountability.

- A. In the church accountability takes place with a trusted friend.
- B. There are two extremes to avoid.
 1. We are not to be too severe.
 2. We are not to be too lax.
- C. There are two types of accountability.
 1. Vertical (with God).
 2. Horizontal (with one another).

II. The Desirability of Accountability.

- A. We are less likely to stumble into a trap.
- B. We don't get away with unwise and sinful actions.

III. The Demonstration of Accountability.

- A. Stop and consider the value of accountability.
- B. Choose another person with whom to be accountable.
- C. Commit to spending time together.

Conclusion: Jesus has removed all human distinctions.

PRAYER SERVICE & DEVOTIONAL

HICKMAN COUNTY FLOOD RELIEF

As we began our task of rebuilding some of the homes that had been destroyed by the flood on May first, second and third, Betty and myself made a visit to Centerville Church of Christ. We met with some of the staff to find out what was needed and where we would be working.

We visited the homes of Evelyn Winters and David and Cindy Nash. Water had exceeded thirty inches, and forty-eight inches in these two homes. Clothing, household items, appliances, walls, floors, air conditioning units were all destroyed and most of the electrical wiring. We made a commitment to rebuild these two homes.

On May 15th, we had eight members from Church Street and one member from Westvue that began the task of removing all the damaged materials such as sheet rock, insulation and flooring. When we arrived at the Nash home it had all ready been stripped out. Four of us, went to Mr. and Mrs. A.P. Davidson's home, and began removing sheet rock, insulation, and other materials. This is the couple that had raised approximately seventy foster children. They are in their mid-eighty's and disabled. We had at least thirty-one different volunteers to work on these homes. It is due to the volunteers who were able to work on the relief effort that these three families have moved back into their homes.

We have worked a total of 768 hours, on these homes. We had members from Church Street, Cornersville, Westvue, a Baptist church here in Lewisburg, and Community Baptist Church in Chapel Hill. We carried many loads of linen's, towels, blankets, pillows, that had all been donated to the Centerville Church of Christ distribution Center. Also we had a complete bedroom suite donated by a family here at Church Street, that was given to Evelyn Winters. The Methodist Church in Triune quickly responded with a load of furniture. There was approximately \$7000.00 given by Church Street members to be used in this mission. We want to thank everyone who supported this work either by working or giving of money to be used for materials.

Below are figures that show how the contributions were spent:

Evelyn Winters — Air conditioning duct replacement \$1,900.00

David & Cindy Nash — Floor covering \$2000.00

Finishing sheet rock \$700.00

Misc. materials for the 3 houses:

sheet rock, plywood, window casing, baseboard, electrical supplies — \$1,737.00

Balance of \$700.00 left in account.

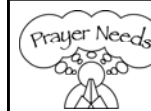
